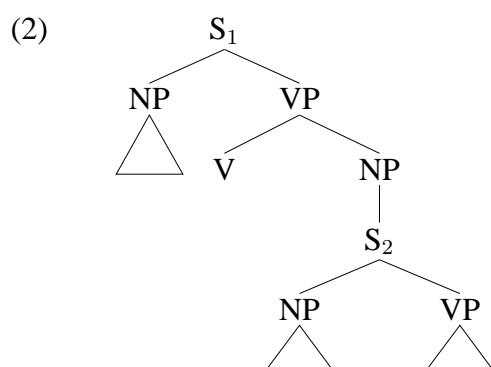
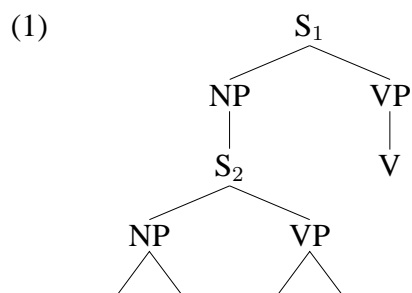


**1. Aufgabe 7**

- (11) *certain*: SnSA obligatorisch, Kontext (1)
- a. \*Martha is certain (for) Harold to leave (nichtkoreferente Subjekte)
  - b. The cat is certain to be out of the bag (idiomatisch)
  - c. There is certain to be a problem (*there*-Einfügung möglich)
  - d. It is certain to rain (Wetter-*it* möglich)
  - e. (i) CBS is certain to interview Martha (Synonymie unter Passiv)
  - (ii) Martha is certain to be interviewed by CBS
  - f. (i) \*That Martha studies politics is certain (Extraposition oder SnSA obligatorisch)
