- 1. Open the folder **IMT** and click on the application icon **Image** Markup Tool 1.6
- From the menu select File → New or click on the icon and open the image Iondon.jpg in the img folder



**3**. Zoom out to 25% (left-hand corner)

- 4. Annotate a relevant section of the image by clicking on Annotation  $\rightarrow$  New annotation or on the icon
- 5. In the open window 'Annotations by category' you can create an annotation category by clicking on (e.g. ID: note\_possession; colour blu; shape round)
- 6. In the same window 'Annotations by category' select the created category, add an *annotation title* and some text within ...
- 7. Close or low the window; the annotation area can now be dragged on top of the relevant zone of the image and sized appropriately
- Repeat 4-7 to create other annotations (also overlapping) by changing categories and shape or colour

#### The UVic Image Markup Tool Project

- 7. You can change the metadata of the XML file that is created by the application:
  - a. by changing the image metadata (box for the title of the image)
  - b. by editing the TEI header: click on TEI  $\rightarrow$  Edit teiHeader
- 8. Save (File → save or □) in the same folder where you have the image. A TEI P5 XML file is created; it contains an element SVG to manage the created annotations.
- 9. See the file on your browser by clicking on File→Create Web view or on *m*

Name and format of the file need to be specified (e.g. annotatedimg.htm).

#### The UVic Image Markup Tool Project

At this point, the application creates the following :

- a. A copy of the XML file you have created with the XSLT declaration
- b. A copy of the image (dimensions suitable for a web page; to control this click on Options → Web view preferences or jin)
- c. An XSLT file (copied from the application folder, but modified with some variables suited for the current document)
- d. A JavaScript file (copied from the application folder)
- e. A CSS style-sheet (copied from the application folder)
- f. An htm page
