





Anti-Gender Politics in the Populist Movement

Book Presentation with Elżbieta Korolczuk

Opposition to "gender" has become a key element of the rise of rightwing populism, which successfully harnesses the anxiety, shame and anger caused by neoliberalism and threatens to destroy liberal democracy. Elżbieta Korolczuk and Agnieszka Graff offer a novel conceptualisation of the relationship between the ultraconservative antigender movement and right-wing populist parties, mapping the antigender campaigns as a global movement, putting the Polish case in comparative perspective.

Elżbieta Korolczuk is an associate professor in sociology at Södertörn University (Stockholm); she also teaches at the Gender Studies Centre at Warsaw University and the Institute for Advanced Study, Political Critique in Warsaw. Her research involves: social movements, civil society, politics of reproduction and anti-gender campaigns. Her latest publication, co-authored with Agnieszka Graff, is:
